He is a beautiful bird, though modestly apparelled; something smaller than either winter or summer yellow-legs, but built on the same graceful lines and plainly showing all the characteristics of his family—long in the legs, strong of wing, and equally good at the table as are the other two. This type of integrated, science-based habitat management maximizes private and public dollars for conservation. Until then, local birds provide some hunting but the best shooting typically occurs from mid-to late October.
