But in terms of Britain's future character or economic advantage, it shows little sign of serious thought or foresight. And some moan that foreigners are taking all the jobs: He is rigorous and meticulous as well as telling really good stories about individuals or groups that encapsulate his point almost always that immigrant groups are diverse, their experiences different but similar, and that they have enriched us – noting that I use the language of us – indigenous – when I am one – immigrant.

It's an enlightening reading, especially in these after-Brexit times. You only have to pick up any paper on any day in this country to find some kind of polemic against immigration. Whether it's bogus asylum seekers, official government figures, racial tensions, bureaucratic screw-ups, deportations, there's always bound to be someone, somewhere complaining about immigration to this country.
