Monopole antennas are presented. Particularly, the monopole antenna is described in relation to a conducting ground plane and analyzed with image theory as.

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The ground plane used with a monopole may be the actual earth; in this case the antenna is mounted on the ground and one side of the feedline is connected to an earth ground at the base of the antenna. Using image theory, the fields above the ground plane can be found by using the equivalent Monopole Antennas antenna in free space as shown Monopole Antennas Figure 1 b.
